

PROJECT REPORT IN 2020: OFFICIAL FUTBOLNET PROGRAM WITH BARÇA FOUNDATION



S.C.P. Japan was the only organization in Japan that officially contracted with Barça Foundation as a local partner. We conducted a regularly held official FutbolNet program, a social inclusion program through sport invented by Barça Foundation and with them, supported the promotion of the program in Japan. We also supported facilitators' training courses for FutbolNet online and visited certified facilitator's sessions for follow-up reviews.

【Official FutbolNet Program: 2 organizations】

- In total, the program was delivered eleven times through the partnership with Global Kids Method and Utsunomiya West Elementary School.

The session was organized every Saturday in Utsunomiya, Tochigi prefecture since October. (October 3, 10, 17, 24, 31, November 7, 14, 21, 28, December 5 and 12)

- In total, the program was delivered six times through the partnership with the Global Sports Classes of CLARC Memorial International High School, Yokohama campus, from October to December. (October 14, 21, 28, November 11, 18 and December 2)

WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM THROUGH SPORTS IN ZAMBIA IN COLLABORATION WITH JOICFP [INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION PROGRAM]



S.C.P. Japan made an external expert agreement with JOICEP, a non-governmental organization to support sexual and reproductive health in Zambia, to support the women's empowerment through sport program for young women living in rural areas of Zambia, Africa. The program provides knowledge of sexual and reproductive health, sexual violence and leadership skills.

- Yoga for women in maternity

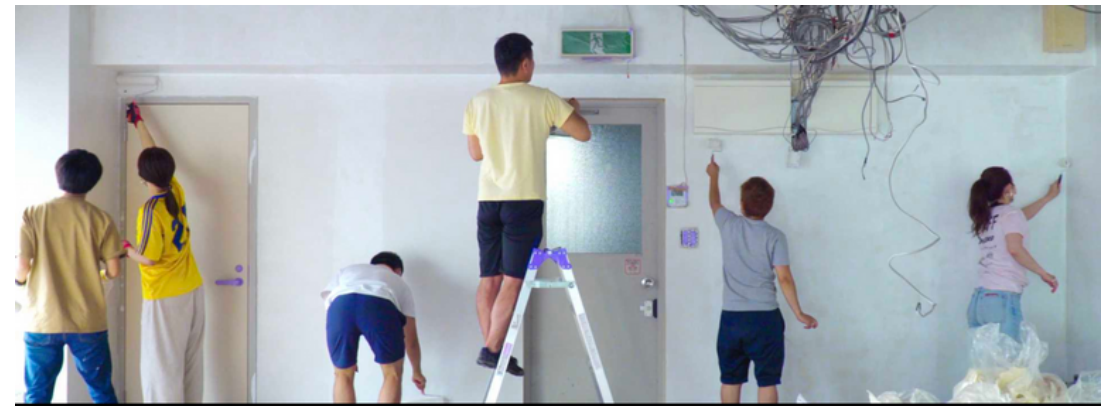


PROJECT REPORT IN 2020:

We joined the Pride House Consortium in July 2020 to raise awareness and disseminate information regarding SOGI (LGBT) issues through sport. As the leader of the Athlete Messages team, our co-chair Ms. Noguchi is involved in creating contents for the Pride House Tokyo Legacy Guidebook and an opening message video from athletes. Pride House Tokyo Legacy, the first permanent LGBT center in Japan, opened in Shinjuku, Tokyo on October 21st.
